

A RALLYING CRY FOR LEAVING NO ONE BEHIND

Background

In September 2023, the world will gather at the <u>SDG Summit</u> in New York for the mid-point review of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the implementation of its 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The Summit is expected to adopt a political declaration that will provide a road map for putting the world back on track to achieve the SDGs by their 2030 deadline. The Summit will be informed by the <u>2023 Global Sustainable Development Report</u> prepared by an independent group of scientists. Political declaration process for the SDG Summit 2023

The Co-Facilitators of the political declaration for the SDG Summit, the Permanent Representatives of Ireland and Qatar, convened the second informal consultations on 16 March to hear Member States' views on the <u>Co-facilitators elements paper</u>, which had been released on <u>28 February</u>. Permanent observers and representatives of major groups and other stakeholders also gave their views and proposals on the paper. Statements from the meeting may be found <u>here</u>.

The President of the General Assembly spoke at the opening of the meeting. In his remarks, he called for an ambitious and transformative outcome that would lead to transformative actions. The Deputy Secretary-General joined the latter part of the meeting to brief Member States on the UN system's preparations for the SDG Summit. She stated that the Summit was the centre piece of the UN's work in 2023.

The elements paper has a three-part structure, modelled on the 2019 declaration. The headings in the elements paper are: "Our Shared Resolve", containing statements of commitment and re-affirmation; "Our Changed World", taking stock and impact of multiple crises; and "Turning Our World toward 2030", to outline actions and recommendations. While the proposed structure of the elements paper was generally well received, some groups of delegations emphasized a range of issues of importance for preparing the zero-draft declaration. Introduction to the July HLPF

In a world challenged by geopolitical tensions, the recovery from COVID-19 pandemic, the climate crisis and rising poverty, ministers, high-level officials and stakeholders will gather at the United Nations <u>High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development (HLPF)</u> in July to chart the best way forward to bring the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) back on track. A milestone event towards the SDG summit, the 2023 HLPF will be held on 10-19 July, with the three-day ministerial segment of the forum taking place on 17-19 July.

The HLPF, convened under the auspices of ECOSOC, will carry out an in-depth review of the following set of Goals: Clean water and sanitation (SDG 6); Affordable and clean energy (SDG 7); Industry, innovation and infrastructure (SDG 9); Sustainable cities and communities (SDG 11); and Partnerships for the goals (SDG 17). This year, 41 countries and the European Union will present their Voluntary National Reviews – aiming to share their lessons learned in the context of implementing the sustainable development agenda post-COVID-19. The theme for the Forum is "Accelerating the recovery from the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) and the full implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development at all levels".

A series of special events will be organized in conjunction with the HLPF, in collaboration with various partners. The special events aim to mobilize stakeholders most engaged or impacted by the implementation of the SDGs. Regional Forums on Sustainable Development: steppingstones to prepare for the SDG Summit

As the preeminent platforms for follow-up and review of the 2030 Agenda in the regions, the 2023 Regional Forums for Sustainable Development help build momentum across regional

constituencies, taking the pulse on SDG progress in the regions, identifying opportunities for transformative action and promoting partnerships at the regional, subregional and country levels. The forums serve as steppingstones to the SDG Summit in September and regional preparatory events towards the July HLPF.

In addition to undertaking a regional review of the 2030 Agenda and the SDGs, the five forums also provide excellent opportunities for representatives of major groups and other stakeholders to interact with ministers and policymakers. From February to April this year, five regional forums are being organized. Two of the five forums have already taken place – the Africa one in Niamey, Niger, from 28 February to 2 March 2023, and the Arab Forum in Beirut, Lebanon, from 14 to 16 March 2023.
