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Kenya NSO and National Human Rights Commission

- ✓ NSO: mandate to report on Nation data
- ✓ National Human Rights Commission: mandate to report on human rights

✓ *Impact:*

- ✓ More reliable data for National Human Rights Commission
- ✓ More insights on those left behind through monitoring by the National Human Rights Commission




Collaboration between KNCHR and KNBS

- ❑ Kenya National Bureau of Statistics and Kenya National Commission for Human Rights signed an MOU in July 2017
- ❑ The main objective of this MOU is to:
 - ✓ Establish a collaborative relationship
 - ✓ This assists in various ways to foster progress of reporting SDGs

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How the work has advanced HR and SDG Reporting

❑ KNBS has been able to produce the following data:


- ✓ PWDs in the last census of 2019
- ✓ Refugees, asylum seekers, statelessness persons in the last census of 2019
- ✓ Intersex data in the last census of 2019

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How the work has advanced RH and SDG Reporting

- ✓ OVCs in the last census of 2019 & in 2019 Kenya Violence against Children Survey
- ✓ FGM in 2014 Kenya Demographic & Health Survey
- ✓ The elderly in the last census of 2019
- ✓ Street children & families in 2018 National Census of street families
- ✓ Children in conflict with the law in 2020 Economic Survey

Key lessons learnt

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- ❑ The key lessons learnt from human rights to inform data collection and reporting for SDG 16 in the national context include:
 - ✓ Data is available to:
 - ❖ Feed into the national SDG reporting
 - ❖ Inform policy direction
 - ❖ Provide and set response plan

Key lessons learnt

- ❖ Provide information for targeted advocacy
- ❖ Monitoring & evaluation of programmes/projects
- ✓ Several targeted financial support to persons with severe disability, the elderly & OVCs is being done in Kenya
