BACKGROUND

Marking an unprecedented watershed moment for the international community, the United Nations 2023 Water Conference in March 2023 represented the first UN-convened Conference on water in nearly half a century. Thousands of world leaders, leading voices from civil society, business, youth, indigenous peoples and women gathered in New York to contribute to a once-in-a-generation event and committed and called for greater action to protect and shape a sustainable future.

A main outcome of the Conference is the Water Action Agenda: it collects water-related voluntary commitments to accelerate progress in the next five years of the Water Action Decade. Building on on-going efforts and utilizing the political momentum created by the Conference, the Water Action Agenda aims to mobilize action across countries, sectors and stakeholders to meet the global water and sanitation related goals and targets. In addition, the Summary of Proceedings by the President of the General Assembly sets forth game changers to super charge global efforts for water-related goals and targets. During the proceedings, the Blueprint for Acceleration: SDG 6 Synthesis Report on Water and Sanitation 2023 will be launched. Written by the UN-Water family of Members and Partners, this Report provides a forward-looking collective vision for sustainable and resilient water and sanitation management in the second part of the 2030 Agenda.

Introduced in 2020, the SDG 6 Special Event takes place annually during the High-level Political Forum giving space for discussion on water-related targets within the SDG 6 Global Acceleration Framework. After reflecting on the Water Action Agenda voluntary

commitments, the President of the General Assembly's game changers, the country acceleration case studies, and the recommendations outlined in the SDG 6 Synthesis Report 2023, the Special Event will conclude with a forward-looking dialogue to build consensus as the international community considers a more robust global response to the international water crisis and also prepares for the SDG Summit in 2023 and the Summit of the Future in 2024.
