Priorities and key messages from the Africa Regional Forum on Sustainable Development.

- Forum highlights Africa's lagging progress and regression on several Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
- Africa holds 55% of the global population living below the poverty line.
- Chronic hunger in Africa has increased from 15.1% in 2010 to 19.7% in 2022.
- Disproportionate impact of climate change on Africa, coupled with challenges in raising climate finance.
- Limited investment in SDGs due to a constrained revenue base, high capital costs, and a growing sovereign debt burden.
- Urgent need for accelerated and scaled efforts to realign Africa with SDG targets.
- Adoption of the Second Ten-Year Implementation Plan for Africa's Agenda 2063, upcoming Summit of the Future, the 4th Conference on Financing for Development and Social Summit next year as opportunities for optimism.

- Africa's priorities for the Forum and the Summit of the Future:
 - 1. Inclusion of Africa and the global South in international governance and decision-making.
 - Accelerated implementation of the Global Digital Compact to bridge the digital divide and ensure secure digital ecosystems.
 - 3. Urgent reform of the global financial architecture to better serve Africa and developing countries.
 - Revitalization of national frameworks and financial channels for integrated implementation of the 2030 Agenda and Agenda 2063.
 - Advancement of the UN Secretary-General's efforts to close the SDG financing gap through the proposed SDG stimulus.
 - 6. Enhancement of the policy environment for sustainable finance and fostering innovations in climate finance.
 - 7. Promotion of just transitions and investment in early warning systems and climate literacy.
 - Substantial budget allocations for poverty reduction, addressing gender inequalities, and supporting women and youth.

- Concrete actions to leverage the youth demographic dividend through increased investments in education, nutrition, and health.
- 10. Utilization of the African Continental Free Trade Area and the global climate agenda to sustainably harness natural resources and boost food security.
- 11. Strengthened global solidarity and efforts to ensure peace, good governance, and development.
- 12. Transformation and modernization of statistical systems to enhance access to quality, disaggregated data for SDG actions.
- Appreciation for support from the African Union Commission, UN organizations and development partners.
- Call for increased and coordinated support for timely delivery on the 2030 Agenda and Agenda 2063.
