We need to strike a balance between food security and energy security. Given the food-energy nexus, we need cooperation at all levels. On Thailand's part, we are seriously looking into strategies and measures to increase agricultural productivity, ensure sound water management and promote energy security. Our Integrated Water Resources management bring together stakeholders to determine how to meet the long term need for water. On Energy, We will continue to explore and expand the use of alternative energy with the promotion of new research in this field.
